ELEVENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (A) - Mass Book Pg 33

(Hosea 6:3-6, Romans 4:18-25, Matthew 9:9-13)

This weekend, after the season of Easter and the feasts that always fall on the Sundays after Eastertide - Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi - we are back in green, celebrating the 11th Sunday of Ordinary Time. The word 'ordinary' usually means 'nothing special' but in these weeks which make up the greater part of the year we are to contemplate and honour the 'mystery of Christ in its fullness' - hardly 'nothing special'! Ordinary really refers to the counting of weeks with 'ordinal numbers' - so we might wonder what happened to the other 10, if this is now the 11th Sunday? The answer is that we count backwards from the last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Feast of Christ the King, which is always the 34th Sunday as well as being the 5th Sunday before Christmas. This 'season' has its own distinctive colour, green, which reminds us of growth and life. As we journey through the year we are continually nourished by the Sacraments and by the word of God.

This week we take up once more St Matthew's account of the ministry of Jesus, with a brief account of the sending out of the twelve on mission. They are told not to go to pagan territory but to the 'lost sheep of the house of Israel'. Jesus is not expressing favouritism towards his own race so much as indicating that God's plan for the salvation of the whole world has to unfold in stages. Israel was originally chosen to be the people through whom the whole world would be lead back to God. For the most part, the people lost their way and failed to live up to this great calling, but it was from within this people that the promised Saviour emerged not only to redeem Israel but to give life to all people. The authority and task given to the twelve -the same as the number of the tribes of Israel - is immense, for they are to do all that Jesus himself has done. When Our Lord ascended to the Father forty days after the resurrection he gave them an expanded mission - the proclaim the good news to all the nations. This mission was not given only to them but to the whole church – it is a mission we share in. And it is a task motivated by love - our love for the Lord and our love for all those he loves. We may be daunted by the scale of the task, even if we think just of our own circle of friends, colleagues and acquaintances. Yet we are not given this mission alone, but as part of the Body of Christ. The Holy Spirit goes before us, gives us courage, and helps us to know what we should say and do in order to bring people to know the love of God. We do not need to browbeat people, but simply to show that being a follower of Christ makes a positive difference to our lives, and not to be afraid to be known as a Christian. Let us take note of one specific instruction Jesus gives us: to ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his

harvest. This means praying for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life, as well as praying that those whom God calls will respond generously. It also means praving for vocations to other areas where we need a strong and positive example of faith – in teaching, in healthcare, even in business and politics. It means praying that we ourselves will respond generously and boldly to whatever God asks of us, for when we make a prayer like this we have to be ready to be part of the answer. Finally, as we consider the different callings that exist within the life of the church, on Father's Day let us think especially of those called to marriage and parenthood. 'Father' is the name by which we are invited to address the God who made us, the first person of the blessed Trinity. A name which expresses his loving care for us. And the fact that this name is also given to some of us mere mortals is an awesome joy and privilege and a reminder that we are called in our human relationships to mirror that divine love which is beyond human comprehension. The blessing of fathers in the rite of Baptism says "With their wives they will be the first teachers of their children in the ways of faith. May they be also the best of teachers, bearing witness to the faith by what they say and do in Christ Jesus our Lord." May God bless all the fathers in our parish, including those who exercise a spiritual fatherhood, may God receive in his tender care those of our fathers who have died, and may he be close to those who for a variety of reasons feel the absence of a father as a source of sadness.

On one evening each week there is a Mass in Church at 7.30pm, followed by refreshments and conversation in the Social Centre afterwards. Please take some of the invitation cards and use them to invite neighbours to come along, especially anyone you haven't seen in church for a while. The third of these gatherings takes place **this Tuesday (20th June)** aimed at those living in the area we have termed **Upminster North**. This area includes everywhere north of the railway line that isn't Cranham: Hall Lane and the roads to the West, as well as the area between Hall Lane and Front Lane south of Upminster Hall playing fields. The last two area Masses are **Wednesday 28th June,** for **Cranham**, and **Wednesday 5th July** for **Upminster East & West Horndon** (St Mary's Lane east of Wantz bridge, North Ockendon and Bulphan as well as West Horndon).
