SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (A) - Mass Book Pg 152 (Acts 1:2-14, 1 Peter 4:13-16, John 17:1-11)

We are in the middle of the original novena - the nine days between Our Lord's Ascension, and the promised coming of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost. The Acts of the Apostles tells us that the apostles spent this time together in prayer, joined with Mary and some of the other men and women who had followed Jesus.

We do not know exactly what they were praying for in those days, but our gospel gives us a privileged glimpse of Jesus' own prayer at the last supper. He prays for his disciples and for all those who shall be led to faith in him through their preaching and witness. It is a prayer for the whole church, and a prayer especially for unity. This is a special time for us to join in focused prayer for ourselves, our parish and the universal church in the run-up to Pentecost, the day of the church's birth in the Holy Spirit. We should never underestimate the power of prayer, which is a means of drawing closer to Christ and to those for whom we pray, and of being conformed to his will (for we are not seeking to change God's mind, but to allow him to shape ours).

I encourage you to pray in particular for the following intentions:

- For the success of our parish mission (first week of October), as a time of renewal for our parish and each of us. Please pray in particular for those who are currently making plans for this week, for those who will lead the mission, and for all who will take part.
- For Jonida, who is to receive the sacraments of initiation on Pentecost Sunday, and for all those families preparing to celebrate baptisms in the coming months.
- For the young people of our parish preparing to receive Our Lord in the Eucharist for the first time, and for those who will be confirmed when the Bishop visits our parish in September.
- For the couples of our parish preparing for marriage in the coming months. For the young people from our parish and our diocese who will be taking part in the pilgrimage to Lourdes and World Youth Day in Portugal this Summer.
- For the schools of our parish, the pupils, staff and governors.
- For all those involved in particular ministries in our parish.

- For those who have drifted away from practicing their faith, and for those who
 have not returned to practicing their faith after the covid pandemic.
- For vocations to the priesthood and religious life, as well as a desire on the part
 of all people to discern their particular vocation and a generosity in saying 'yes'
 to whatever God wants of us.
- For the sick and housebound of our parish, all who are struggling with physical and mental health, and those who are finding life burdensome and difficult.

Use this special time to pray also for whatever intentions are close to your heart. Please pray also for me, that I may serve God and this parish faithfully. May God grant us a fresh outpouring of his Spirit.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

AREA MASSES

Did you know that our parish extends from Upminster Bridge to West Horndon, taking in the villages of Bulphan and North Ockendon as well as Upminster and Cranham?

This summer there will be a series of evening Masses and social gatherings designed for people living in the different parts of our parish.

South of the railway line and east of Station Road/Corbets Tey Road, as far as Wantz bridge.

Tuesday 20th June – Upminster North



Wednesday 28th June - Cranham

North of the railway line taking in Front Lane and Avon Road as well as the roads to the East or North respectively. Also Rectory Gardens and Meads Lane.

Wednesday 5th July - Upminster East & West Horndon

St Mary's Lane East of Wantz bridge mini roundabout and side roads including the 'Cathedral' roads, Pike Lane, Clay Tye Road, Ockendon Road, as well as West Horndon, North Ockendon and Bulphan.
