TWELFTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (A) - Mass Book Pg 37

(Jeremiah 20:10-13, Romans 5:12-15, Matthew 10:26-33)

It's sometimes claimed that the phrase 'Do not be afraid' appears 365 times in the bible - once for every day of the year. That's a nice thought, though not entirely accurate. Nevertheless this phrase or something like it is one we find over and over again in the bible. But what makes it more than just a platitude, words of reassurance without any substance? The answer, very simply, is Jesus, who has proved himself mightier than any power on earth or in heaven. It's not just a case of 'keep calm and carry on' in the face of adversity, but a deep trust in the one who has and who will prevail over everything that is opposed to God and the building up of his kingdom of peace.

Jesus warns of the violent opposition his followers will face. This is not only a thing of the past, for there are many parts of the world where simply to identify as a Christian and to gather for worship is to place oneself at risk of harm or death; and yet in such places people still live their faith with courage and steadfastness. Places where the persecution of Christians is rarely headline news, and yet a daily reality for those who live there.

Jesus doesn't simply tell us not to be afraid, but not to be afraid of the wrong things. We should not fear those who can only harm our bodies; but we should fear that which can cause harm to our souls. The human person is a union of body and soul; and these two are not in opposition. Death brings temporary separation, but we profess in the creed a bodily resurrection; we will enjoy eternal life as whole people once more, not as disembodied spirits. Bodily death will come to us all, and it is something most of us fear because it is a step into the unknown; but it is a necessary step, because we are not meant to live for ever in this world, in our present bodies.

Thus we have a paradox: Catholics are the most vocal defenders of all life, as a gift from God; but we also have a certain indifference to life in this world. We who have received life from God, we are called to make a gift of ourselves to him in return, mindful that life in this world is only a preparation for the eternal life of heaven. And so we are rightly zealous in defending the right to life of others especially those who are less able to protect themselves, but with regard to our own lives we are encouraged to adopt the attitude of St Paul: if I die or if I live, it is for the Lord.

So, in Jesus we have no need to fear those who harm only the body; we know that we are destined for something far greater than the confines of the present material world. Who or what then should we fear? Jesus speaks of the one who can kill the

soul. And we should remember that though we are saved in Christ, we have a real enemy, who longs to drive a wedge between us and God. We call him the devil, or satan, and we shouldn't dismiss him as a mere symbol of evil. We shouldn't underestimate his power - because he is a fallen angel, and angels are mighty beings. But we shouldn't overestimate his power over us either, because he is no match for God. The poet Dante depicts him as a pitiful, sad creature, for having deliberately cut himself off from God and rejected all that is good, he is utterly devoid of hope, and his only satisfaction is in dragging others down to this pit of despair. He knows our weaknesses, where we are most vulnerable to temptation. The tools of his trade are deceit and flattery: he inserts himself between us and God, as he did in the garden of Eden, sowing seeds of distrust, and leads us to think either that we are such dreadful sinners that we are beyond redemption and should just give up, or more likely that our sins don't matter, that we can just carry on as we are with no need of repentance or amendment of life. Both these lies cleverly distort the reality of God, so that we no longer see him as a loving father, whose law is designed to help us grow and flourish; we see him as an arbitrary, petty killjoy, or simply an irrelevance to us. So we must dismiss this lie out of hand and embrace the truth: God loves us, and sent his son into the world to share his life with us. The devil truly has no power over us if we set our hearts on God and keep coming back to him no matter how many times we fall. Let us place our trust in Christ, knowing that if we remain in him, we truly have nothing to fear.
