PENTECOST SUNDAY (A) - Mass Book Pg 22

(Acts 2:1-11, 1 Corinthians 12:3-7,12-13, John 20:19-23)

Today, the Solemnity of Pentecost, is not only the end of the Easter season, it is also the 'birthday' of the church. We celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and the beginning of the apostolic mission, by which the Good News of our new life in Christ was made known to the whole world beginning with those assembled in Jerusalem for the Jewish feast of Pentecost.

The connection between Easter and Pentecost runs very deep. The Preface at Mass today describes the gift of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost as bringing the Paschal Mystery to completion, uniting us the adopted sons and daughters of God to his only-begotten Son. On Easter Day and for the fifty days that followed we celebrated Christ's resurrection from the dead, the victory over the grave which was won for our benefit; we celebrate not because one man happened to rise from the dead, but because in him we too are risen, and it is the gift Holy Spirit which makes that 'in him' part possible. The disciple received this gift first on Easter Day, and then in a more dramatic and public way on the day of Pentecost itself. Our risen life in Christ begins in the waters of Baptism, which is the moment the Holy Spirit begins to dwell in us to bring about that union with Christ, a gift which is 'sealed' in the sacrament of Confirmation as we receive the gifts that enable us to play our part in the mission of the Church. Like Easter Day itself it is a very appropriate moment to celebrate the sacraments of initiation, as we will do in our parish today, for the very first Pentecost saw some 3,000 added to the body of Christ through baptism.

In celebrating Pentecost, we are, certainly, celebrating a past event. But, as with Easter, that is not all we are about today: the activity of the Holy Spirit is very much part of our present, and it is not restricted to a single day in the year. The Holy Spirit, like the wind, can only be seen by its effects, sometimes gentle and sometimes dramatic. He is as present to us as the air we breathe, but we should not forget that he is a divine person – not a Star-Wars-like 'force' but very definitely a 'who' rather than a 'what', properly referred to as 'he' rather than 'it'. In the Creed we rightly call him 'the Lord', just as we call the Father, Lord, and the Son, Lord. He certainly isn't a thing, a vague spiritual energy that we need a top up of from time to time. He is the one who comes along side us to lead us into the truth. The one whose presence and whose gifts will enable us to speak of the hope we have in Christ when we cannot find the words, who will lead us to pray when we do not know how, who will fill our hearts with an awareness of divine love, when otherwise we might feel alone.

The first and greatest gift the Holy Spirit bestows on those who seek it with open hearts is the gift of faith in Christ and the repentance that leads us to salvation and newness of life. St Paul teaches us that it is the Holy Spirit who leads us to say 'Jesus is Lord'. The other gifts are given to help us walk the path of discipleship more faithfully, and to play the particular part God has given us in serving his church. They are gifts that are freely given, but which we need to actively seek and receive with open hearts if we are to benefit from them – and not just us, for these gifts are given to each one of us in order to bear fruit to the benefit of the whole church and the glory of God.

Our celebration today is an opportunity to remind ourselves of this great truth, that through the power of the Holy Spirit the risen Christ lives in us, and we live in him. Let us pray expectantly that our hearts may be opened once more to all that the Holy Spirit wishes to give us, and let us not forget to give thanks and praise to Almighty God for all the blessings than he has already poured upon us; above all for the divine life he has shared with us.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. Amen.
