(1 Kings 3:5.7-12, Romans 8:28-30, Matthew 13:44-52)

I have been privileged to spend the past week in Lourdes, accompanying the youth service group as part of the diocesan pilgrimage. Today's gospel speaks of a treasure which is worth giving our all to obtain. Not, of course a material or worldly treasure, but something of an entirely different order that can nevertheless be experienced even as we live in that world. Something of that heavenly treasure is visible in Lourdes, a place where we see God's love in action. It is evident in the way each individual person is treated as a person of immense value, no matter how frail or weak. It is evident in the generosity with which people give of themselves to help others, and by learning to see that person as a sister or brother, rather than simply an object of pity, receiving much from them. It is evident in the love of God which permeates everything: for Lourdes is ultimately not about the good we do, but about God's initiative in making his presence felt amongst those the world often prefers to forget about. It is no coincidence that Mary chose to appear to a poor, sickly child, at a rubbish dump on the outskirts of an insignificant village. Everyone is precious to God – and the treasure of his love is to be found in all sorts of places.

When the kingdom of God makes its presence felt in our world, it is something joyful, but it also challenges us to become the people we were made to be: open-hearted and willing to make a gift of ourselves so that we can become more fully alive in him. When we pray 'thy kingdom come' we are not simply asking that the whole world may become more like Lourdes – wonderful though that would be – we are looking forward to a new heaven and new earth where the very best we experience on earth is raised to an unimaginable degree, and we are also praying for a transformation that begins in our hearts, so that we may be ready to live in that kingdom.

August is a time of rest or at least a change of pace for many of us, especially those whose lives are shaped by the school year. It is a chance to reflect on what is important and – especially for the young – to reflect on what God is asking of us. For families, this month can be an opportunity to spend more time together. It is also a time of waiting for those who have just sat public exams, and a time to make plans for the future. In all this let us not forget that we are made for eternity. Jesus calls us to follow him now so that we can life with him for ever, and to help us on this journey he gives his mother to us as our mother, who loves us with a mother's love and never stops praying for us. However much we might be looking for social-media worthy experiences, in our hearts we know that what is most important is our relationships.

We are made for communion, and heaven is place of perfect communion, perfect love. The greatest blessings of this life, including times of rest and relaxation and time spent with friends and family, are a foretaste of the incomparably greater joy that awaits us. I myself will be away for some of this month, enjoying a break with my family as well as a few days on retreat. If you are travelling, then I encourage you to look up local Mass times in advance as part of your holiday preparation, and if attending Mass in another language – a wonderful way of experiencing the universality of our faith – then you may find it helpful to look up the Mass readings for the week on universalis.com.
