CENTENARY CELEBRATION WEEKEND

One hundred years ago, the parish priest of Romford Fr Jules Van Meenan took a great risk: he decided to hold a fête to raise money that would allow him to buy a plot of land on Sunnyside Gardens in the growing village of Upminster and build a modest church there. Just nine months later that risk paid off, as the community which gathered to worship there was ready to be declared an independent parish within the Diocese of Brentwood. Perhaps the only 'mistake' was not to make that first church bigger, as a decade later it proved necessary to build a new church, where we are now.

This story is a part of our past, and we rightly celebrate today, the Sunday following the anniversary of the founding of the parish, looking back with gratitude for all that has been achieved by past generations of Catholics in Upminster. As the present parish of St Joseph's we are called not only to build on that century-old legacy, but also to continue the witness of those many generations who, at great personal risk, kept the flame of faith alive in this area during the period of Catholic persecution.

Our gospel describes another 'risk' which is at the heart of the Good News that our mission week has equipped us to share. God's risk in creating us, with the freedom that is necessary if we were to be truly made in his image and likeness; and his risk in sending his own son into the messiness of human existence: as Fr Simon summarised it last week, becoming an 'empty, humble, obedient servant' for our sake. Our Lord knew that he would be violently rejected by many, even most, of those he came to save, just as God's previous attempts to call the people he had made back to himself had been rejected. But he did it anyway, for the sake of those who would not reject him, and for those who would turn to him even having rejected him at first. God did not have to do any of this. He did it simply out of love. The parable in the gospel also alludes to the false premise which many of those who rejected Jesus operated on. They thought they could take what they wanted for themselves, rather than receive as a gift what God had always intended to share with them. The sin of Eden repeated in every age. Yet God did not, and does not, hold back from revealing his love for us: love that is manifested not in power but in emptiness, humility, obedience, and service. Something that is far more powerful

than the world understands. This is the Good News that changes our lives if we have truly taken it on board, and hopefully this week has helped us do that more deeply.

I have a two-fold invitation: first of all, please do come along to St Peter's this afternoon to celebrate the completion of a wonderful mission week. Whether or not you were able to come to anything during the week, this afternoon's shared lunch is an opportunity once more to reconnect, rediscover and rejoice together! If you weren't able to join us during the week, there are some things you can watch online such as Fr Simon's homily, and presentations on scripture and the eucharist, and I'm sure there are plenty of parishioners who will happily talk to you about their experience of the week, even this afternoon.

Secondly, if you have been touched at all by what you've experienced this week, even if it was a moment of private prayer or an individual conversation rather than one of the big events, please don't just leave it at that. This week isn't meant to be something that happens then we move on. As with a retreat or pilgrimage, this mission week might give us something of a spiritual 'high', and it will hopefully also challenge us in some way. So we should resist the temptation to return to normal life as if nothing had happened. Wherever you are in your faith journey, whether a lifelong Catholic or someone who has found themselves, perhaps unexpectedly, starting to think about 'religious' questions, there is room for us to grow and deepen our understanding of the faith and its implication for our lives. There are two follow-up events planned for this autumn:

The first is an introduction to a new course, **Our Catholic Faith**, designed for everyone and anyone, those just starting to explore Catholic Christianity, those who feel ready to join the church, and those who want to explore their faith more deeply. The course will run all the way to Easter, but this first evening is a taster evening and an opportunity to ask questions, open to all with no commitment to carrying on. It will be in church on **Thursday 19th October**, **7.45pm-9pm**. If you can't make Thursday evenings (as the course will continue on Thursdays after half-term) but want to be part of this then please speak to me or get in touch by email. The second opportunity is a **Parish Forum**, an open meeting for all connected with our parish on **Sunday 5th November** in Church from **4pm-6pm**. This will be a time of prayer and discussion, thinking about how we build on the mission week as a parish community. If you can't make this, but have ideas or feedback you wish to share, please get in touch. We hope to be joined by one or two of the Sion mission team. All are welcome to both events, and in both cases the time in church will be followed by an opportunity to spend time together in the Social Centre.

And finally, thank you to our wonderful Mission Team from Sion, who have worked extremely hard all week, and for our parish team who have also been working hard, mostly in the background, to ensure everything goes smoothly!

Anyone thinking about becoming a Catholic, and anyone wanting to deepen their understanding of our faith, is invited to a welcome and enquiry evening for a new parish course **'Our Catholic Faith'** from 7.45pm-9pm on **Thursday 19th October** (in church). Everyone is invited to a **Parish Forum** on **Sunday 5th November** from 4-6pm in church, when we will have an opportunity to pray together and discuss how to build on our mission, hopefully joined by one or two members of the Sion mission team. Both occasions will be followed by a chance to meet one another in the Social Centre.
