(Malachi 4:14-2:2.8-10, 1 Thessalonians 2:7-9.13, Matthew 23:1-12)

What should the church look like? In this month of November we are reminded that there is much more to the church than what we experience on earth. Throughout this month dedicated to the Holy Souls we contemplate that part known as the 'Church Penitent' - those who have come to the end of their time on earth and are now being prepared for the perfection of heaven. Christ has willed it that our prayers should play a part in this process of cleansing and purifying, whilst we also continue to benefit from their prayers. November began with the celebration of All Saints, holding before us the great communion of saints who have been "washed clean in the blood of the lamb"; the 'Church Triumphant' who not only enjoy the fullness of light and joy in God's presence but are also urging us on to join them. What about us? The church on earth is known as the 'Church Militant', recognising that we are still caught up in that tension between the values of the world and the values of God's Kingdom. We are called to take up our cross and follow Christ, relying not on our own strength but on God's grace; recognising that we will fall often but the mercy of God is greater than our weakness. As the pilgrim people of God we journey onwards, keeping our eves fixed on our heavenly homeland and seeing the world around us in a new light. Our first task is to worship God, and our second task is to make his love known in word and deed, so that more and more people may come to know him and love him and so find lasting happiness.

The past month has seen a significant gathering in Rome known as the Synod of Bishops. The purpose of this meeting was to reflect on the listening process that began a couple of years ago at parish level, and prepare for a further meeting a year from now. Alongside bishops representing every part of the world, Pope Francis invited an unprecedented number of lay men and women to participate as voting members of the Synod. At its conclusion Pope Francis repeated one of his recurring themes: that the church must avoid the danger of 'clericalism'. This echoes the message in today's gospel. The opposite of 'clericalism' is not a flat, leaderless body. Our Lord himself did not want the body of his followers to be 'like sheep without a shepherd': he chose the apostles and gave them specific authority, giving St Peter pre-eminence among them. But this authority was specifically to do with extending the gift of divine mercy in his name, whilst the added responsibility given to St Peter was a special concern for the well being of the flock of Christ. The church does have a pyramid structure, but it is a structure of service, rather than honour, aimed at the

holiness of all its members. There is an ever-present temptation to turn the focus from God to ourselves, which Jesus addresses in the gospel. I have the privilege of being a 'father' in two respects, and our parish community includes a number of teachers and a number of fathers. Jesus often challenges us with an exaggerated manner of speech and here he draws attention to the misuse of such titles and positions. Only when we recognise our utter dependence on God can we properly carry out the tasks he has given us to exercise in his name. We must always keep God at the centre and use whatever positions of influence and responsibility he has given us to serve him and those entrusted to us.

The other danger of 'clericalism' is that we lose sight of the shared responsibility which the whole body of Christ has for the mission of the church. It is not simply a matter for the 'professionals'. Pope Francis's vision, summed up in the word 'synodal', is of the people of God walking together, listening to one another, recognising each other's gifts and the contribution we might be able to make. It is a month since we held our parish mission, with the aim of building our parish into a stronger and more joyful community of missionary disciples, able to live and share our faith with greater confidence than ever. Many people have spoken positively about their experience of the week; not only the input from the mission team, but also the opportunities to share conversation and food together. And that was really the point of the mission! It is important that this is not lost. This Sunday we are holding a Parish Forum, an opportunity to spend time together discussing how we want to go forward. We will be joined by Teresa, who led our mission, and Rose, another member of the Sion Community who is taking over Teresa's leadership role. I hope to see lots of you there, and if you can't be there please take this opportunity to pray for our parish, and reflect on what part you may play in our future. And pray for me, that I may be a faithful father and teacher of this parish community!

PRIMARY SCHOOL APPLICATIONS: Fr Matthew will be issuing Certificates of Catholic Practice to parents applying for places at Catholic primary schools who have been attending Mass each week, on Tuesday 14th November 4-6pm and Thursday 23rd November 5-7pm. You do not need to bring anything, but you will need to submit a baptism certificate to the school along with the Supplementary Information Form, as well as completing the local authority online application by the deadline in January. If you know that you have not been practicing your faith on a weekly basis you are still encouraged to apply to the school without a Certificate of Catholic Practice, as there is a good chance that a place may be offered on the basis of your child's baptism.
