Over the past couple of weeks I've seen the nativity story retold by various groups of children from our schools in songs, readings and drama. It is a familiar story but one which we should not tire of hearing. This is a wonderful part of our preparation for Christmas, and on the fourth Sunday of Advent, which this year quickly merges into Christmas Eve, our focus is on the last stage of God's preparation, and the first chapter of the Christmas story: the nine hidden months Our Lord spent in his mother's womb after Mary had consented to her part in God's plan, communicated by the Archangel Gabriel.

This story is the reason why we decorate our homes, exchange gifts and cards, and come together for special meals. It describes an event - a real event in history - that has had an impact like no other. The one whose birth is celebrated around the world at Christmas – even by people who celebrate without really being aware of what it is all about - is no ordinary human baby. Fully human, yes, but also the Son of God. To use the language of St John, the eternal Word of God, who is God, through whom all of creation came into being, has now become part of creation. He does so in order to close the gap between God and his creatures. By sharing our humanity, it becomes possible for us to share his divinity. That is the extraordinary truth we celebrate at Christmas. As a great feast – second only to Easter – we celebrate not just for one day, but for a whole season taking us up to the feast of the Epiphany and concluding with the Baptism of The Lord. Even then, we continue in a lower-key way (keeping the crib up) until Our Lord's Presentation in the Temple forty days after his birth.

It's hard to resist the Christmas celebrations spilling into Advent, but hopefully we can still do the Christmas season justice! The days

following Christmas include a number of feasts that gain extra significance from their closeness to Christmas: the first martyr Stephen, the evangelist John, those innocent children caught up in Herod's attempts to destroy any rival. Exactly a week after Christmas we celebrate the beginning of a new calendar year, but we also honour Mary as the Mother of God: a title which highlights the wonderful truth that the Son of God has a human mother; God himself has become a tiny baby utterly dependent on his mother. This same God who became small for our sake, placed in an animal's feeding trough, becomes even smaller as he is placed in our hands or on our tongues as the Bread of Life. There is no greater gift, and nothing more magnificent that we could feast on than this, and it is not just for one day!

As I mentioned in my earlier Advent message, there is darkness as well as light in the Christmas story. Our Lord comes precisely to bring the light of God into a world that has gone astray. The darkness that is present in the Christmas story is no less present in our world today, but the light of God is also just as present, shining through the church and the witness of his followers. God's peace is not merely an absence of conflict, it is a peace that comes from all things being ordered according to the will of God. Only then do they - we - fulfil God's purposes for them and attain that good for which they were made. We pray for true and lasting peace in our world and especially in the Holy Land, as well as Ukraine and elsewhere, and we pray for the victims of war. Let us pray too for all those for whom Christmas is a challenging time, through bereavement, sickness, homelessness, family difficulties, or worries about work and money. You are not alone. Finally, if you are travelling over the Christmas period, I wish you safe travels, and if you are visiting Upminster or coming home for Christmas, then welcome (back).

CHRISTMAS OFFERING: By long established custom the Christmas offering is a gift to the parish priest, and is much appreciated as a significant part of his income for the year. Your gift can be gift-aided in the usual way, as it has to go through the parish accounts like any collection. To avoid any confusion, the collection taken up at the normal Sunday Masses this weekend, as well as standing orders and online/contactless donations for parish funds all go towards the running costs of the parish in the usual way. Anything placed in the collection taken up at the Masses on Christmas Eve (5pm onwards) or Christmas Day, as well as anything marked Christmas Offering passed on by other means, will be counted as part of the Christmas Offering for Fr Matthew.

ANGELUS CARDS: On this Fourth Sunday of Advent when we think of the beginning of the incarnation, cards will be distributed with the text of the Angelus, the daily prayer which commemorates that pivotal moment in our salvation. This prayer is recited at the beginning of our weekday Masses and you might like to use it at home. If you can, you might pray it in the morning (6am is traditional! – or you might pray with those gathered in church at 9.15am) as well as noon and 6pm.

We will pray these prayers at the end of Mass on the appropriate days. In the traditional (but often misunderstood) language of the church, these acts are opportunities to gain an indulgence, that is, an extra outpouring of divine mercy and grace that helps our growth in holiness, when joined to confession, reception of holy communion, prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father and a desire to live a virtuous life.
