PARISH NEWSLETTER 9TH / 10TH MARCH 2024 FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT (B) - Mass Book Pg 83

(2 Chronicles 36:14-16.19-23, Ephesians 2:4-10, John 3:14-21)

On this fourth Sunday of Lent our penitential discipline is lightened by a sense of joy at the coming salvation that is to be accomplished. Today we give thanks and pray for our mothers and also honour holy mother Church, echoing the words of today's entrance antiphon which speaks both of joy and of Jerusalem as a mother. Our mothers (together with our fathers) don't just bring us into the world; they also bring us up. They take care of our bodily needs but also prepare us for life in the world in every respect. Perhaps one of the most important but easily overlooked lessons our mothers and fathers teach us is to take responsibility for our actions – "I'm sorry" – and also by their own example to teach us the importance of forgiveness. Both movements are present in the petition of the Our Father which I would like us to consider today: Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.

St Paul says if we have no sin we deceive ourselves. Only a very foolish person would consider that they were perfect in every respect, that nothing could possibly be wrong with any of the choices they might make. Certainly, someone might reject the notion that there is a God who cares what we do. But we who know God to be a good and loving Father know that he must care about what we do as any parent cares about their child's actions, because he wants us to be the best we can be, the people he has made us to be: images of God in his utter perfection. We are made for holiness, for sainthood. We know that we fall short, but we do not need to despair because God is a loving Father. Like any child finding their way and trying to please their parents but inevitably making poor choices, deliberately or thoughtlessly, we only have to say "I'm sorry" to receive the assurance of God's forgiveness. When our relationship with God is damaged by our wilful pride, our sinful self-reliance, then we only need to turn back to him and all is made well. Turn back, because all our selfish choices represent a turning away from him. So we ask for forgiveness in this prayer which is a model for all our prayers; asking for forgiveness when we realise we have gone wrong is a feature not just of this prayer but our prayer in general. Holy mother Church has been given a particular remedy for sin, namely the sacrament of confession or reconciliation. Our awareness of our sin and our awareness of our need of God's mercy should not lead us to become locked up in quilt, rather to avail ourselves of that medicine which Jesus freely gives us through his church.

For our lesser sins and shortcomings, simply asking forgiveness will open the wellsprings of divine mercy. But forgiveness is not just something we receive then carry on. We are meant to be changed, to become more like God who is love and mercy. The example of our parents forgiving us teaches us to forgive. Similarly, the experience of divine mercy teaches us and also forms and moulds us to become people who are merciful. It's not so much a gift with strings attached but a gift that is meant to change us. If we are not willing to be changed by our encounter with divine mercy then we will find ourselves in the sorry position of that servant in the well-known parable in Luke's gospel, the one who is forgiven an enormous debt by his master, but refuses to forgive the miniscule debt of his fellow servant. It is right that our petition for forgiveness should be linked to a plea that we might become people who readily forgive as we have been forgiven. Forgiving others is not something we always find easy, which is why Our Lord, knowing this, instructs us to ask that this change be brought about in us. May our hearts be open not only to the mercy of God but also to the grace that makes us merciful as our heavenly father is merciful.
