(Acts 3:13-15.17-19, 1 John 2:1-5, Luke 24:35-48)

For one more time during this season of Easter our Sunday gospel takes us back to the day of resurrection. We hear Luke's account of the appearance of the risen Lord in the Upper Room on Easter evening, just as the two disciples who met the Lord on the road to Emmaus return to tell of what they experienced. Two lines stand out for me: "Their joy was so great that they still could not believe it" and "you are witnesses to this". The first captures that sense of something too good to be true – they have moved beyond the initial confusion following the desolation of Good Friday then then discovery of the empty tomb, but they are still in a state of shock. Jesus gives them both a physical demonstration that it really is him risen from the dead, then a lesson in the scriptures so they can understand that God's plan of salvation has now been fulfilled. But the second line I mentioned involves them, and us, in that work of salvation which entered into a new phase with the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Jesus helps them understand that the vocation of Israel – leading the whole world to know and worship its creator – is now entrusted to the church. We are those who Jesus referred to in last week's gospel as those who have come to believe without seeing for ourselves – relying instead on the testimony of others – but we still have a vital part to play in handing on the faith.

The mission of the church takes on various forms. It certainly does include being ready to speak about our faith in Jesus Christ, announcing that good news that Christ has risen from the dead and that in his name forgiveness and new life is offered to all people. But it also includes acts of loving service towards those in need. Love certainly prompts us to share the good news, but it is love seen in action that makes this message authentic and compelling.

Let us not forget about that joy mentioned in the gospel. In sharing our faith, we cannot hide the fact that the call to discipleship is one that can be costly to follow. Our Lord did say that we must be ready to take up our cross and follow him. The Christian gospel is a promise of new life, not of this-worldly comfort. But this is not the same as saying that the followers of Christ must be miserable – far from it.

Christian joy is not a matter of pretending that suffering doesn't exist or making light of such difficulties, but a deeper joy that doesn't depend on short-lived good fortune. A joy that comes from our friendship with the Lord, the certainty that we are loved by a good Father who desires the true and lasting happiness of all his children. Joy, even when carrying the cross, is one of the hallmarks of a saint. If we are to give witness to our faith, then radiating this deep joy is a necessary part of it. If people see that our faith makes a positive difference to our lives, and gives us a cause for deep joy even in the midst of the challenges life brings us, they will naturally be more curious than if they see us weighed down and miserable. Mother Teresa – who certainly knew about hardship and sacrifice – said 'Let us always meet each other with smile, for the smile is the beginning of love.' May God help us radiate his light, joy and peace and use us to announce the gospel of salvation.
