(Acts 10:25-26.34-35.44-48, 1 John 4:7-10, John 15:9-17)

In today's second reading we have perhaps the most significant statement in scripture about God's nature: "God is love". We do not believe merely in a supreme being, greater than anything else we can conceive of, outside time and space – he is all that, but also, He is love. This statement is entirely consistent with our belief that God is a Trinity of three persons in one being; a concept that we can never fully grasp or explain yet seems best understood in the light of this truth, that God is love and as such must have some element of relationship in his very being.

Because God is love, he has a desire to create. As the creatures made in his image and likeness, we are made out of love, and we are made for love. God, though infinite and eternal, wants to be close to his creation. He becomes part of his creation in order to restore it to its original goodness, lost by sin. And having returned to his rightful place once his work was completed, as we celebrate this Thursday, the eternal Son of God, the Word made Flesh, continues to be close to us through the life of his Church. At the Last Supper he speaks of the love which he receives from the Father and which he shares with us. He desires our friendship, and asks of us only that we strive with his help to live up more fully to our truly human identity, made in the image and likeness of the God who is love. As Pope St John Paul II taught in his first encyclical, Christ doesn't only show us what God is like, he also shows us what we are meant to be like, and what by grace we can become.

Today and next week around 60 children of our parish will receive Our Lord in Holy Communion for the very first time. They have been well prepared for this moment with the support of our team of catechists and their families who, perhaps, have been inspired by the faith of their children and stirred to a greater love of Our Lord in the Eucharist. Let us pray for them and for ourselves, that our love may increase, and that as we love more, even to the point of making costly sacrifices, we will become more and more alive in God.

This month of May begins with the celebration of the English Martyrs, those men and women of all walks of life who were willing to die rather than deny their faith, bearing witness to the importance of communion with the whole church, and to the centrality of the sacraments (for their 'crime' was often related to hiding priests, or celebrating or taking part in Mass). This month is also dedicated to the honour of Mary, the Blessed Mother of Our Lord who is given to us and the whole church as mother by her son: one who shares our joys and our sorrows, and who teaches us to place our

trust completely in God, to love him with all our hearts, and to seek his will in all things. We will honour her with the traditional May crowning at each Mass this weekend. May she continue to aid us with her prayers.
