PARISH NEWSLETTER 15TH / 16TH JUNE 2024 ELEVENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (B) - Mass Book Pg 30

(Ezekiel 17:22-24, 2 Corinthians 5:6-10, Mark 4:26.34)

On Thursday of last week we held the first of a series of Masses and social gatherings to celebrate different forms of service within our parish community. I have spoken about the church's primary mission of making disciples; a disciple is someone who has come to know Jesus Christ and seeks to live in an ever-deepening friendship with him. We hear in the gospels – even before the events of Jesus' death and resurrection - how the followers of Jesus spent time with him, as well as going to different places on his behalf to speak of the coming Kingdom. Christ must be at the heart of our community and at the centre of everything we do. We come together not only to meet with one another - valuable though that is - but to meet with him, to be fed and formed by him, and then to be sent out into the world by him. The first major document from the Second Vatican Council reminds us that "Christ is always present in His Church, especially in her liturgical celebrations." Specifically, he is present through the ministry of the priest and the gathering of the people united in prayer. "He is present in His word, since it is He Himself who speaks when the holy scriptures are read in the Church." And in a unique way he is present in the Blessed Sacrament, Christ's own body and blood given to us in Holy Communion.

This Thursday's Celebration of Service is focused on those who help us encounter Christ in Word and Sacrament – those who read at Mass, and those who assist with the distribution of holy communion in church and in the homes of the sick and housebound. I'd like to reflect briefly on these ministries now and the part all of us have to play in facilitating this privileged encounter with Christ.

Firstly, the Word. You may recall from the story of the Road to Emmaus how the Risen Lord, unrecognised at first, prepared the two disciples fleeing Jerusalem by explaining the scriptures. Later, after recognising him in the breaking of bread, they said 'did our hearts not burn within us!'. The Bible is God's Word, communicated to us by a great many human authors, inspired by the Holy Spirit, using many different genres and arising from different contexts and periods in history. It is good for us to read the bible, but in the liturgy it is more important for us to *hear* the bible and allow God to speak to us. The selection of readings helps us understand how the whole of scripture points to God's ultimate self-revelation in the Word Made Flesh, Jesus Christ. Through the bible, we not only learn about God, but we come to know him in a personal way. It may help us listen better during the Liturgy of the Word if we have found time to read and reflect on the upcoming readings beforehand. If you don't

have a missal you can find the readings on the Universalis website, and there are weekly reflections for adults and children on the Wednesday Word site. NB I will say more about the new translation for readings at Mass nearer to its launch in Advent, but missals are available to pre-order from the repository and online (don't buy the current version by mistake!).

Secondly, and of even greater importance, the food with which Christ feeds us in Holy Communion, which I wrote about recently for the feast of Corpus Christi. As the experience of lockdown showed us, there is no substitute for a real, face-to-face encounter. We can participate in Mass, and even hear the word of God, remotely, but in Holy Communion we have an intimate encounter with our risen Lord that is mediated through something material. Whether you receive communion from a priest or deacon (an 'ordinary' minister) or a lay 'extraordinary' minister, it is Christ who is feeding you. As we approach the altar, let us pray that every obstacle to this encounter may be lifted so that we may receive everything he wants to give us. Those of us who are able to gather in church, and those of us who receive the eucharist at home, not only receive life-giving nourishment, but are truly united with one another and with Christ, in what should be the high-point of our week.

Thank you to those who share in the ministry of Word and Sacrament, and to all who serve our parish community.
