(Acts 12:1-11, 2 Timothy 4:6-8.17-18, Matthew 16:13-19)

This weekend we take a break from green to celebrate one of the great holy days of the year, commemorating the apostles Peter and Paul. It seems odd that these two men who played such a key role in establishing the church should share a feast rather than each have their own. They are both in fact commemorated by other feast days during the year but this joint feast is significant for a number of reasons. It emphasises both the complementarity of their missions – Peter primarily to the people first chosen by God, and Paul to the gentile (i.e. non-Jewish) world – and the unity of their message: the good news of the one risen Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ. it reminds us of their common fate – bearing witness to Christ through blood in the city of Rome. In honouring these great men, we honour God whose grace accomplished extraordinary things in them, and we marvel at the way in which God chooses and uses ordinary human beings in spite of their evident shortcomings. May he also deign to use us to fulfil his purposes!

There are in fact many different ways in which he *does* use us to carry our his work in the world. During June and July we are celebrating different forms of service in our parish community with a series of Thursday evening Masses and social gatherings. This coming Thursday our focus is on the many different groups that exist in our parish engaged in a range of activities, as well as individuals engaged in specific works of mercy. There are so many different groups and activities that come under the umbrella of St Joseph's parish that it would be easy to overlook something, and I apologise if so. What these groups have in common, apart from a link to our parish, is that they include elements of fellowship and outreach. Both are important. Meeting regularly with other Catholics with whom we have a particular common interest is an opportunity to develop deeper bonds of friendship and provide support and encouragement in living out our faith in the world. Outreach – whether that is providing hospitality, companionship, fundraising, or intercessory prayer – means that groups and individuals don't become inward-focused, but instead put into practice the commandment to love our neighbour.

In putting the spotlight on a particular form of service each week, I have tried to do a number of things. Firstly, to thank and encourage all those who are involved. Secondly to highlight what opportunities for service exist in the parish so that we might prayerfully consider if there is anything we could get involved in. Thirdly to show how each area of service relates to our own lives as followers of Christ. All of our parish groups are open to new members and would be happy to tell you more

about what they do – coming along on Thursday might be a good way to meet some of the other members. Of course you don't have to belong to any groups other than the Church itself, but as followers of Christ we are all called to practice works of charity in our daily lives, and to encourage one another in this.
