(Genesis 3:9-15, 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1, Mark 3:20-35)

After the highs of Eastertide and the great feasts of Pentecost, Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi, we settle into the longest 'season' of the year, Ordinary Time, with the first green Sunday since before Lent. The colour green might prompt us to see this as a time of growth, focused on getting to know Christ better through the gospels so that we might follow him more closely. Recently I spoke about the great commission at the end of St Matthew's gospel: make disciples! This is the first task of the church, and it requires us to become more fully formed as disciples ourselves so that we might share what we have received: the invitation for all to become fully alive in Jesus Christ.

How we go about making disciples depends on our own context. The primary vocation of the baptised people of God is to serve him in the world, leading others to Christ by the witness of our words and deeds. As a parish community, this work of evangelising includes forms of outreach, and also the welcome we offer to those who come through our doors, searching for something they may not be able to articulate.

This summer we have a series of Masses to celebrate different areas of service and ministry within our parish community. Although I am contacting the coordinators of each ministry to pass on invitations, the Masses are not private or exclusive: anyone is welcome to come along, perhaps as a gesture of appreciation to those engaged in this service or to find out more about getting involved. Please come along if you have shared in a particular ministry in the past and have since 'retired', and if you can't make 'your' Mass, feel free to come to a different one. The first Mass, this Thursday, is for those who make our church a place of welcome. This includes the ministry of welcome at our weekend Masses, as well as those who help make our church building a clean and attractive (and safe) place to visit. It includes unglamorous tasks such as cleaning the toilets, which are kept open so that the church may be welcoming to those who pop in during the day — even those who just come into the porch to use the loo! And with welcome being central to what we are about, those who administer our financial resources at the service of our parish mission are also involved in this.

Welcome is not just a task for a few volunteers, however. We all have a part to play. I recently heard someone pose the question, do those attending Mass see themselves as guests or hosts? In one sense we are all guests at the wedding feast of Jesus Christ. However, those who are already part of this parish community are also in the position of being hosts to those who visit us, those joining us as new parishioners,

and those who come out of curiosity or are beginning to explore questions of faith. Being hosts does not mean being over-bearing like Basil Fawlty, but doing what we can to put others at ease. It may seem trivial, but we cannot overestimate the value of a warm greeting and friendly smile.

People often say that we are a pretty friendly and welcoming parish, which is great. However we shouldn't be complacent. We may not always get it right, but we should strive to do our best. If there are any ways in which you think we can do more or do better, please let me know. One thing I think we do need to restart is the ministry of contacting and befriending newly-registered parishioners, so I would be glad to hear of anyone who might volunteer for this.

Thank you for all those who are actively involved in making this church a place of welcome, and I hope to see you on Thursday.
