(Deuteronomy 4:1-2.6-8, James 1:17-18.21-22.27, Mark 7:1-8.14-15.21-23)

At the end of the Bread of Life discourse Our Lord asks his disciples if they want to leave, like the rest of the people. The disciples no doubt have also found Jesus' teaching challenging, but their response is different, because they have come to believe in him. There are times for all of us when we are challenged by some aspect of our faith or another – perhaps we even find ourselves beginning to doubt whether any of it can be true. What we need is not the certainty that comes from having worked everything out for ourselves, but the confidence that comes from knowing and trusting someone. There will usually be someone who has led us to faith, someone we trust and whose opinions we value. Our faith may seem strange to many people, but as we get to know other members of the community of faith, we will realise that we are in fact in good company; there are others who have come to believe, who no doubt also struggle at times but nevertheless have recognised in the message of Christianity something compelling and, ultimately, true. As well as the people we know personally, this faith is shared with a great many good, intelligent, thoughtful people who live or who have lived in many different places and times: among them scientists, philosophers, artists, saints and sinners. At the heart of it is not a set of propositions we must give assent to, but a person, Jesus Christ, the Son of God who has risen from the dead, who alone has the message of eternal life. This message is not some secret piece of knowledge imparted to a few but an invitation to turn to God and follow him with all our hearts, within the community of faith that he has founded.

All priests are required by Canon Law to go on an annual retreat. As such, I will be spending a few days this week with a Benedictine community, sharing most of their pattern of prayer and life. This is a real privilege – a time of spiritual renewal and

reorientation towards the things of heaven. As we return to Mark's gospel after our few weeks with John (for the second weekend of this newsletter) we are reminded that true worship is directed to God, and not meant to be inward looking or self-referential. True worship is, moreover, for our benefit not God's, as it stops us being people who are inward looking and self-referential, but people who know they are made for communion. As things return to normality after the summer break, it is good for us to have this gentle reminder that God must truly be at the centre of everything. This is the very reason we are here Sunday by Sunday, to be fed and thus transformed by the one who feeds us, so that we can become more fully alive in him and fulfil our true potential, to the glory of God. We may not all have the opportunity to spend time away on a retreat, but let us try and keep each Sunday as a special day to reorient us to the Lord.
