(Isaiah 50:5-9, James 2:14-18, Mark 8:27-35)

This weekend a national Eucharistic congress - 'Adoremus' - is taking place in Birmingham, with representatives from every diocese including our own. Coinciding with this, every parish across the country has been urged to hold extra times of Eucharistic adoration. Thus, in addition to our usual Saturday evening adoration, there will be periods of adoration between the Sunday morning Masses, and after the 11am Mass.

What is the significance of Eucharistic Adoration? The word 'adoration', related to the word 'adore', is linked both to worship and to an intense form of love. It comes from the Latin phrase 'ad ore' - 'to the mouth'. We use our mouths to eat, breathe, communicate (with speech and expressions), and to express in different ways affection between spouses, parents and children, family and friends. Mouths can even be used to resuscitate one who is unable to breathe.

All these meanings are in the background when we consider adoration in relation to God. To be 'to the mouth' to God implies a 'face to face' personal relationship. We also think of Adam, receiving the breath of divine life at the moment of his creation. When we adopt a stance of adoration towards God, we worship him in his infinite majesty, whilst also delighting in a relationship of extraordinary intimacy. We recognise him as the one who gives life to us, and the one who does so because he wants to share everything with us, purely out of love.

What better focal point to lead us into this stance of adoration than the Eucharist? We have been reminded during the past month, in our reflections on the Bread of Life discourse in John's Gospel, that the Eucharist is the food and drink of eternal life. But it is not only food, it is the real presence of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. The one is true God and true man, who comes close to us especially in his Eucharistic presence, to give us life. We therefore rightly worship him as God-with-us, Emmanuel, when we kneel before him in his real presence in the Blessed Sacrament. We can of course do this any time in church as he is always present in the tabernacle, but when we are able to see the Blessed Sacrament exposed in the monstrance on the altar during times of Eucharistic Adoration, we become even more conscious of his presence.

What are we meant to do during Adoration? Simply, be still, physically and mentally. Of course, it's never quite as simple as that. Distractions inevitably come to us when we try and pray. To aid our prayer we might bring to mind episodes from the life of

our Lord, or reflect on a verse of scripture. There are many traditional prayers of the church which we might find helpful. And we can combine these things in the rosary - a devotion which I think is entirely appropriate for Eucharistic adoration since Mary always leads us to her son. We can take our time with these things, and allow as much still, silent space for God as we can. It is absolutely fine also to think about whatever is on our mind, family or work situations, things we are sorry about, grateful for, or worried about, as we might talk to a friend - for that is indeed what we are doing. (As an aside, particularly when Eucharistic Adoration is held before Mass it is understandable that we might want to talk to our friends in the congregation who we see once a week; but perhaps we might keep it to a brief greeting at this point, talk to God before Mass, and each other after Mass.)

At present in our parish we routinely have Eucharistic Adoration nearly every day, and the church is open extensively for prayer in the presence of the tabernacle outside these time. Even a brief visit - or even making the sign of the cross as we walk past a Catholic Church housing the Bread of Life - brings to mind the one calls us into an intimate, life-giving relationship. As I write these words I am reminded of what the Archbishop of Paris said in a TV interview following the terrible fire that devasted Notre Dame: when asked what this magnificent building was for he said, 'a piece of bread' – the bread which we honour because it is also our living God, who chooses to be present to us in this way. Let us adore him for ever.
