PARISH NEWSLETTER 26TH / 27TH OCTOBER 2024 THIRTIETH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (B) - Mass Book Pg 71

(Jeremiah 31:7-9, Hebrews 5:1-6, Mark 10:46-52)

I concluded a recent list of bullet points setting out a vision for the parish with "Trusting that **anything is possible** to God, if we seek **his will** in all things."

Whatever else we might say about a parish community, if we aren't trying to do and be what God wants us to do and be, then we are wasting our time. Whilst if we limit ourselves to what we have always done, or what we think is manageable or practical, then we are also going to sell ourselves – and God – short. Fortunately we have a constant reminder in our church building of the Holy Spirit, represented as a dove, the form he took at Our Lord's baptism, high above the sanctuary.

Our Christian life is naturally ordered towards heaven. Our worship of God is of central importance because it reminds us of this, and lifts us beyond the limited horizons of this world. We are a pilgrim people, called to journey onwards to the promised land, but never making the mistake of thinking we can get there by our own efforts alone. The church came to birth on the day of Pentecost through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and it is this same Spirit, constantly at work in the Church, that brings about the growth of every single one of her members. Trusting that all things are possible with God goes hand in hand with seeking his will. The story of salvation is one of God working through those he was called, and who have freely responded to his call; whilst the story of our own personal salvation is one of cooperating with God, who helps us but does not override our personal freedom. As a parish community, therefore, we need to give God the opportunity to work through us, prayerfully discerning the way ahead in every task we undertake, and prayerfully examining our own motives to ensure we are always acting for God rather than for ourselves. But it also means being generous in our response to God, ready to play our part rather than sitting back and waiting for something to happen. And recognising that for some of our community, prayer might be the special part they are able to play at a particular stage in their lives.

Towards the end of this week, as October rolls into November, we mark a significant feast in the church's calendar which celebrates the whole body of Christ and reminds us of the bonds that unite us with those who have gone before us. Many people will celebrate Hallowe'en without realising that there is a Christian thread along with the other aspects. More than a celebration of darkness, it should be a reminder that the light of Christ overpowers the darkness, light which is reflected in the saints (the Hallows referred to in the name), and that his rising has conquered mortality itself so that the host of plastic skeletons are a reminder of the dead who are in fact still alive;

reminded too of our own need to live as those for whom death is a gateway to the fullness of life.

The definition of a saint is someone who seeks God's will in all things – and more than seeking, actively delights in it, knowing with complete trust that God's will is for our good. The vision for our parish community concludes therefore with a reminder of our destiny, to become saints robed in glory and light, and of our great task in this life which is to become God-centred rather than self-centred. And if this seems too hard – something for others but not for me – let us trust that anything is possible to God! That even sinners can become saints, and so gain everlasting life in the company of all the saints. Even if we haven't overcome our self-will in this life – as most of us probably won't – we will be made ready for the perfection of heaven through the work of Christ and his church. As the members of the church on earth we play our part in that through our prayers for the souls of the faithful departed, as we in turn will benefit one day for the prayers of those who come after us, and we are all helped by the prayers of the saints in heaven, urging us on to the finish line. May we desire to be with them, as much as they desire us to be with them.
