THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT (C) - Mass Book Pg 160

(Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15, 1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12, Luke 13:1-9

The three middle Sundays of Lent have a special place in the preparation for those to be baptised at Easter. On each Sunday a rite known as a 'scrutiny' takes place. Catechumens are urged to scrutinise themselves in the light of the gospel, to be more aware of their need for God, the help of the sacraments, and the conversion of life that allows us to become more fully alive in God. It



is, of course, good for all of us to become more deeply aware of these things as part of our own Lenten journey. The Scrutinies will be celebrated at the 11am Mass and we should keep our catechumen Hiren in our prayers, along with his family, as well as our candidate for reception into the full communion of the church, Niall. When the Scrutinies are celebrated we always use different prayers for the Mass as well as the year A readings (this week, page 163 in the purple book).

The gospels associated with the Scrutinies have since ancient times been seen to have a special resonance with the journey towards baptism. For the first Scrutiny this week it is the gospel of the Samaritan Woman at the well, who responds to Jesus' offer of living water with growing faith and desire for the newness of life that is on offer.

The year C readings which are used at the other Masses (p.160) have a different focus. In the first reading we hear of Moses' encounter with God in the burning bush. God reveals himself as the one who simply is – 'I AM' – as well as being the God who had first revealed himself to Moses' ancestors. And then he tells Moses that he has heard the cry of his people, and was going to bring them out of slavery into the promised land. Note that he does not offer them a quick fix: a long and difficult journey lay ahead of them. But he is faithful, and will not abandon them. This points us towards the beginnings of a response to the hardest question of all, which the gospel sets before us. Why does God allow suffering? It is a

question which we cannot avoid wrestling with, and for many it is an insurmountable obstacle to faith. We are confronted with terrible suffering on our screens, and perhaps in our own lives. Where is God? We cannot fully answer the 'why', but in response to the later question we can point to the cross. And we also point to the empty tomb, Christ's victory over suffering and death, and the promise that all will be made new. This is the hope that sustains us and calls us on, knowing that God will never leave us.

On Tuesday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation, another day 'off' Lent. A few years ago it coincided with Good Friday, and there is profound fittingness that the day the work of our redemption was 'finished' should occur at the same time of year as the day when it all began. Our Lord's 'yes' to the Father preceded by his mother's 'yes' to God, undoing the 'no' of Adam and Eve. There is a connection with the burning bush. God does not impose himself on us but acts with infinite courtesy. He does not override our free will; this is part of the reason evil and suffering exist for now. Thus like the burning bush our human nature, with its innate freedom and dignity, remains intact, unconsumed but transformed by the presence of the divine in our midst. May our hearts be set on fire with love for the one who loves us so dearly!
