SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (C) - Mass Book Pg 275

(Acts 7:55-60, Revelation 22:12-14, 16-17, 20, John 17:20-26)

The time between the Ascension of Our Lord (last Thursday) and the coming of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost (next Sunday) is the original Novena – nine-day period – of prayer. The Acts of the Apostles tells us that following the Ascension the apostles returned to the Upper Room from the Mount of Olives and "with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers" and again, "When the day of

Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place."

In our gospel we are given a privileged glimpse of Our Lord's own prayer, which occurs at the Last Supper. In this prayer known as the High Priestly prayer - for it anticipates Jesus' offering himself on the cross as the sacrifice of the new covenant – Jesus prays specifically for his disciples and all who will come to believe in him through their testimony. He prays above all that they may not fall under the influence of the evil one, that they will remain in the truth, and that they will be one. These themes are connected, for the evil one is the father of lies and the one who scatters. causing suspicion, enmity and division amongst men and woman, and between God and man.

In the passage given to us this year, the final part of the prayer, the focus is on the unity of his followers in every age. The unity of the church is founded on the unity of God, a Trinity of three persons in one perfect communion. It is not merely an aspiration: we profess the Church to be One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic when we say the Creed, because the church is the body of Chris; Christ is one and he is holy, and the mission he gave his church is a universal one, founded on the teaching of the apostles. It is a unity not merely by the fact of our belonging to a single institution, but above all a unity in love, for love is the essence of the

Trinity. The love that flows within the perfect communion that is God also flows within the members of his church, drawing us ever close to him, and to one another. This unity is not only an end in itself, but also a sign that we are called to give to the world, so that all may see and believe.

We are nevertheless works in progress. Our love is imperfect and often clouded by self-interest. Pride gets in the way; we think we know best. The story of the past two thousand years is one of sinners striving to be saints but certainly not always getting it right. At certain points disputes within the body of Christ have led to a breaking of the bonds of charity and communion which are meant to hold us together in the family of the church, and it has proved almost inevitable that groups who have broken away from communion with Catholic church have experienced further division within themselves. Our Lord prays at the Last Supper knowing the struggles his church will face. His prayer for unity must be our prayer too, and in praying we must strive to be ever more fully aligned with God's will. so that the love we have received may shape our every action and word. Let us pray for all who bear the name 'Christian', that we may be united once more in the breaking of the bread and the teaching of the apostles. and by our unity show that Christ is truly the Son of God sent as our saviour.
