PENTECOST (C) - Mass Book Pg 278/287

(Acts 2:1-11, 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13, John 20:19-23)

The Jewish feast of Pentecost, celebrating the ingathering of the wheat harvest and the giving of the Law on Mount Sinai, occurs fifty days after Passover. Therefore, fifty days after that Passover when Jesus offered himself as the new Paschal Lamb and vanquished death by his rising, Jerusalem was filled with people coming to celebrate another festival. Fittingly on this day, the disciples gathered in the



Upper Room which had become their base, the Holy Spirit descended on them in power, filling them with his presence and his gifts so that the mission of the church could begin.

Today we celebrate a historical event – the birthday of the Church. But, like Easter, it is not only a historical event, but one which involves each and every one of us. We are incorporated into the body of Christ, sharing in his risen life, through baptism; and in that moment we become temples of the Holy Spirit, whose powerful presence is 'sealed' by the sacrament of Confirmation.

In celebrating the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost, therefore, we celebrate his ongoing activity in the life of the church and in the life of every believer, and we also celebrate the Holy Spirit in himself, the third person of the blessed Trinity, co-equal and co-eternal with the Father and the Son.

My choice of wording is deliberate. The Holy Spirit is not a thing but a divine person. A 'who' not a 'what' – according to tradition referred to as 'he' like the Father and the Son, though of course the Holy Spirit is neither male or female. The old tradition of capitalising divine pronouns, though fallen into disuse, at least highlighted that we were not referring to an ordinary human person, but the divine.

We cannot see the Holy Spirit, but we can turn to the images that appear in scripture. The Holy Spirit – to be clear – is *not* a bird, but he appears in the form of a dove at Our Lord's baptism, with connotations of gentleness and freedom; echoing the role of the dove in the story of Noah's Ark (itself a sign of baptism) heralding the beginning of a new life in a restored covenantal relationship. At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit appears as tongues of fire and a mighty wind: a sign of extraordinary power which purifies and energises.

We cannot see the Holy Spirit, but we can see his effects if we look attentively, just as we cannot see the wind but we can see its effects in the swaying of trees. If we look at the lives of the saints, those who were especially open to the activity of the Holy Spirit, we can see those qualities St Paul refers to as the fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. The church has long recognised seven 'gifts' of the Holy Spirit which help us live our lives more completely for God and so produce those 'fruits': Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear of the Lord. Let us consider what gifts we need more of, and ask especially for them. Let us also pray especially for our young people who are to be confirmed this weekend (at the 6.30pm Mass), that they too may receive the gifts of the Holy Spirt in abundance and bear much fruit in their lives to the glory of God.

As yet the timescale is unknown. At the same time the Diocese has authorised us to instruct the architects who will develop plans for the new social centre and submit them for planning approval. An initial proposed floor plan is now on display in the social centre and in the church porch. Any suggestions welcome. The range of views previously raised about this project have not been ignored and there will be a fuller response in a few weeks, together with another opportunity to discuss this together.
