This newsletter covers two weeks – for the first weekend, our gospel is the account of Jesus' visit to his good friends Mary and Martha, the sisters who lived in Bethany with their brother Lazarus. Many of us have an instinctive sympathy for Martha. The situation described in today's gospel could easily occur anywhere, at any time, and it probably has in most families at some point or other: one person growing resentful as they end up doing more than their fair share of the work whilst someone else gets away with doing nothing. But this gospel is not a parable about fairness. It's sometimes presented as an illustration of the need for active and contemplative vocations within the life of the church, but that doesn't quite reflect what is going on here either. The simple message that comes from Jesus' own words is that we need to be focused on the one thing that really matters. Martha is so distracted by the serving, that she has forgotten the one necessary thing: God – who just happens to be right there, in her house.

A pragmatic person might say, we can't all just drift through life not doing anything. But that is to miss the point. If our life is about 'one thing' – which is according to one definition, the essence of being a saint – it doesn't mean we ignore all the practicalities of life, but rather it means that the 'one thing' must be uppermost in our minds, and everything we do must be done in the light of that 'one thing.' A life lived for the 'one thing' has an integrity and a clarity that allows the light of Christ to shine through. This is what we are all called to become, and we should take encouragement from the fact that Martha is honoured as a saint with her sister and brother, there feast day occurring later in the fortnight covered by this newsletter. Like here, we are works in progress, and our response to the call to holiness can be thought of as re-focusing our lives so that everything is indeed about Christ, the one thing. Who can rightfully insists on being that one thing are lives are centre on, because he is the Son of God, through whom we have our very being, the one who enables our true flourishing as sons and daughters of God.

am privileged to be spending a week in Lourdes, with over 300 people of all ages from our diocese, who in different ways help each other get the most from the pilgrimage. It is a busy week, especially for those who go in a particular service role. But perhaps in Lourdes more than anywhere else, we can learn the lesson of today's gospel, that serving others can also be a means of being more consciously in the presence of the Lord. By doing all things for love of God and neighbour – last Sunday's gospel – are lives are more completely centred on Christ, who Mary joyfully gives to the world. And so even in the midst of activity, we are able to rest in him, and live in his eternal peace and joy.

The weeks of the summer holiday provide a change of pace for many of us. For some of us that change might be more rather than less frenetic! Let us strive to keep Christ at the centre of everything, business and rest, alike.

Please be assured of my prayers from Lourdes, where I shall leave last year's Paschal candle as a sign of prayer for the parish, along with individual prayer requests.
