At every Mass shortly before communion, the priest recalls words spoken by the risen Lord to his disciples in the Upper Room: "Peace I leave you, my peace I give you"

Our image of Jesus is challenged by a very different message which we hear in the gospel for the first Sunday covered by this double newsletter. "Do you think that I have come to give peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." If our image of Jesus is the gentle teacher, meek and mild, then we will find these words hard to stomach. Indeed, Jesus speaks like this because his

words hard to stomach. Indeed, Jesus speaks like this because his own people have also misunderstood who he is, and what he has come to accomplish.

The peace that Jesus brings is not the peace of one people subjugating another. Nor is it going along with easy choices for a quiet life. It is the peace which comes from all things being in harmonious alignment with God's will, and thus able to fulfil the true meaning of their existence. Jesus has come to make all things new, and to the measure that we are resistant, preferring our own ways to God's, this will be a difficult and even painful process.

To say 'yes' to God means to so 'no' to those things which contradict our life in him. And this is often difficult, especially if it involves saying no to those we love. But again, the path of discipleship is not meant to be an easy path, but the path that leads to life, joy and true peace.

A week later we hear Jesus speak again in response to the question "Will there be few who are saved?" Jesus' response is to urge fidelity to God, rather than worrying about such questions. God is always faithful to the people he made to share his life, but we have to receive his new life as a gift, and be ready to be made new if we are to experience this new life in his kingdom. Salvation is not a matter of right, something we qualify for automatically by belonging to a certain group, but about that 'yes' to God which opens the door to the transforming power of his grace. Through the life of his Church, the people of God gathered from all the nations, we receive the

help of divine grace that kindles the fire of love within us, and enables us to overcome human weakness and the hard heartedness of sin, so that we may be wholly his.

I am writing this on the feast of the Curé of Ars, who, trying to find his way to this village that he had been sent to, said to a shepherd boy, "Show me the way to Ars, and I will show you the way to heaven." Let us never forget that our great task is to help each other get there, showing by our words and deeds, and above all by our faithfulness to Christ in all things, the road that will lead to our eternal joy.

BUILDING UPDATE: Having received feedback on the very-preliminary draft plans from the architect, representatives from the parish met with the architects, and we have received some re-worked designs taking those comments into account. Meanwhile, the property consultants engaged by the diocese are taking steps towards marketing the St Peter's site in the autumn. Nothing is set in stone yet, but we are moving closer to the point where significant decisions will be made, and my intention is to set out in detail the way forward, responding to various comments made so far, in a letter to the parish in September. Please pray for all involved as things begin to take shape, and do feel free at any point to share your thoughts with me - it is after all our project, to benefit the whole parish community.
