The sacrament of baptism is typically administered by pouring water over a person's head using a shell. Shells have a long association with pilgrimage, first being adopted as a badge by pilgrims making their way to the shrine of St James at Compostella. Thus it serves as a reminder that baptism is the start of a life-long pilgrimage.

Journeys, whether of a secular or religious nature, often involve moments of challenge or frustration. Again, this is true of life. What gets us through those moments is hope: hope of reaching a particular destination that will put those difficulties into context. 'Pilgrims of Hope' is the theme which the church sets before us for the jubilee year that we are part way through celebrating. What is the hope that leads us on, especially through those moments when the going is hard, mired in uncertainty?

The gospel readings for the next two Sundays help us see things a little more clearly. First, we are told that our hope is certainly not anchored in worldly success or good fortune. We know how easily our situation can change; plans we have made disrupted by the unexpected. But even if we live out our days in material comfort, it must all come to an end one day. A week later the message becomes starker – we must be ready at all times for a meeting with the Lord at an hour we cannot know in advance. Yet there is also a word of reassurance: 'Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom'. *This* is the basis for our hope: a share in God's kingdom, where we shall experience the fullness of life, in joy and peace, for eternity. Hope that is grounded in the victory Christ has won for us, and the love of God which envelopes us.

Christian hope is the virtue by which our lives are fixed on heaven, and all that we experience in this life placed in the context of our eternal lives. Towards the end of the fortnight covered by this newsletter we are given another sign of hope: the

Assumption of our Blessed Lady. It was fitting that she who brought the son of God into the world should be the first to share his victory, spared the corruption of the grave just as by grace she was freed from the corruption of sin. But we are not merely invited to wistfully gaze upon a reward granted only to the perfect few. We celebrate what can be accomplished in all of us by our cooperation with divine grace. Our 'yes' to God may be faltering and less whole-hearted than Mary's, but it is sufficient, as long as we persevere and turn back to him when we go astray, to allow his grace to work in us and make us holy, ready for the perfect life of heaven.

How can we open our hearts more fully to God, giving room for that transformation to occur? By giving him a little time each day in prayer, by making the most of the means of grace which he generously gives us through the life of his church, and by learning to recognise the signs of his activity in our lives, with gratitude and trust.

Nothing is set in stone yet, but we are moving closer to the point where significant decisions will be made, and my intention is to set out in detail the way forward, responding to various comments made so far, in a letter to the parish in September. Please pray for all involved as things begin to take shape, and do feel free at any point to share your thoughts with me - it is after all our project, to benefit the whole parish community.
