## PARISH NEWSLETTER 15TH / 16TH NOVEMBER 2025

THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (C) - Mass Book Pg 164

(Malachi 4:1-2a, 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12, Luke 21:5-19)

The liturgical year is drawing to a close. Today is the last 'green' Sunday. And there is an obvious connection with last week's readings for the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. When challenged about his actions in driving the money-changers and animal sellers from the temple, Jesus spoke of the temple being destroyed and rebuilt in 3 days. He was speaking of the temple that was his own body, of his death, and of his resurrection.



In today's gospel, Jesus speaks once more of a time when the temple will no longer be standing. By the time the gospel was written down, the temple had in fact been destroyed by the Romans, in 70AD. Jesus goes on to speak of the terrible things that will herald the end of the world – things which are never far from our news headlines. But there is also a word of reassurance and hope: 'not a hair of your head will perish... by your endurance you will gain your lives'.

Nothing – no building, no mountain, no planet or solar system, will last for ever. Our lives in this world will not last for ever. But God is eternal. And we too are made for eternity. Our Lord's dying and rising has opened the door for us to share in his eternal life. The true temple – not made of stone but God himself living among us as one of us – could not be destroyed. God has made us for life and does not allow death to have the final word. This hope is the basis for our practice of praying for the dead, not only in this month of the Holy Souls, but whenever we gather to offer the worship that is pleasing to God: the sacrifice of Calvary brought into our present.

The month of the Holy Souls is a good opportunity to ponder our own mortality, as well as remember those who have gone before us and are now living in closer union with God. It is not morbid at all, but entirely consistent with a Christian acceptance of death, alongside an equally Christian refusal to accept death as being the end of everything. It can be humbling to think, as we pray for the holy souls, that one day we too will be holy souls benefiting from the prayers of the church on earth. In our Catholic faith there is no prayer greater than the prayer of Jesus Christ himself - the Mass - which is why for a Catholic person a Mass is the usual pattern for a funeral, and why it is customary to ask for Masses to be said for those we love. We can't assume those making the arrangements after our death will know what our wishes are, so it is good to write them down somewhere. It is sometimes said that funerals are for the living. From the perspective of our faith, a funeral is of course a moment to offer support, prayer and consolation to the living, but it is above all an act of worship, offered to almighty God, praying for the repose of the soul of the one who has died. In some mysterious way God wishes to use our prayers, involving the whole church in the work of making us ready for heaven, perhaps because he knows it is helpful for us to have something to do for someone we love. Prayer helps to overcome that separation brought about by death, in hopeful anticipation of the day when we are raised up together to sing the praises of God for ever. May this hope sustain us to our journey's end.
