(Isaiah 2:1-5, Romans 13:1-14a, Matthew 24:37-44)

Today we begin a new liturgical year and the great season of watchful waiting and expectant longing that we call Advent. In recent years, advent calendars have exploded in popularity, offering, a daily treat for people (and pets) of all ages and tastes. For many people this is the only relevance the word 'advent' has. I hope that an emerging trend of renaming them countdown calendars doesn't catch on. But it is useful to remember that advent isn't just a time to count down to the big day.



It is an opportunity to open our hearts to the graces that are on offer in a particular way in this season, to be alert to God's activity and unfolding plan of salvation. We look forward in expectant hope to meet Christ, and we prepare for this meeting by learning to recognise him, and ensuring that he is no stranger to us.

We are reminded in this season that our hope is for something beyond, and unimaginably greater than, this present life. Christ himself will come at the end of time to inaugurate a new heaven and a new earth.

We renew our sense of wonder at the events of his first coming, two millennia ago, joining with the holy family in that final period of waiting, Our Lord hidden from view in his mother's womb.

And we also recognise his coming among us through the life of his church: Christ's presence in the sacraments, in the gathering of his community, in the proclamation of scripture, and those we serve.

At last year's clergy Advent quiet day the speaker observed that the best thing about Advent is that it isn't Lent. It doesn't have quite the same penitential character, and it is considerably shorter, but it is a time of preparation, marked by the same colour purple, and the best possible preparation is to remember our real need of a saviour, and to open our hearts to the gift of his mercy by going to confession.

Let us open our hearts to receive all the good things he wishes to give us. And by our keeping of Advent, let us remind the world to keep Christ in Christmas. God bless, Fr Matthew
