THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA (C) - Mass Book Pg 202

(Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12, 1 Corinthians 3-9c-11, 16-17, John 2:13-22)

The name of the feast we celebrate today may leave us a little puzzled. What is the Lateran Basilica, and why is its dedication important enough to trump the usual green ordinary time Sunday, on a day which also has national significance as Remembrance Sunday?

Some background first. A basilica is a major church honoured with this title. The Lateran Basilica, or St John Lateran as it is also known, is one of the four Papal



Basilicas in Rome. And arguably it is the most important of these four, since St John Lateran, rather than St Peter's (the Vatican Basilica), is the Cathedral of the Diocese of Rome - the pope's Cathedral. As Brentwood Cathedral is considered the mother church of this diocese, St John Lateran is the mother church of the Diocese of Rome. But the pre-eminence of the Bishop of Rome, the successor of St Peter, as pastor of the universal church, means that his Cathedral also has a universal pre-eminence. A Latin inscription at either side of the entrance proclaims it as the 'Mother and Head of all the churches in the City and the World'. Moreover its dedication - not just to one of the Johns, but to "Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, St John the Baptist and St John the Evangelist" - reminds us that we do not merely pay honour to the world's Cathedral today, but to the one who is present in and honoured by every single church that exists.

Recently - I can't remember where - I saw a succinct summary of our Eucharistic faith. It went something like "at the heart of worship is sacrifice, at the heart of sacrifice is love". If we do not worship God (and if we do not worship him in the right way - the way he has given us) then something else will fill that void. There are many good things we might want to place high on our list of priorities - things we might consider worth fighting for. Family. The security of our home - be that the four walls we inhabit, or the country we call home. Freedom. But these 'goods' are relative to the only Good that can rightly be the object of our worship, the true centre of our existence: the God who made us, who loves us, and who shares his life with us.

Today's national commemoration of the fallen in war occurs, fittingly, in the month we dedicate to the 'holy and pious' act of prayer for the dead. As the first reading on All Soul's Day last Monday pointed out, prayer for the dead would be 'superfluous and foolish' if death were final. But it makes perfect sense if, as we believe, death has been conquered and changed for ever by the dying and rising of the one who made himself the perfect sacrifice of redemption. Prayer unites us with those who have died, and involves us in their preparation for heaven.

We use the word 'church' to refer both to buildings and the people of God ioined in communion to one another; joined by bonds of shared faith and worship expressed in our loyalty to the shepherds given to us and our reliance on the sacraments by which Christ meets and feeds us. This dual use makes perfect sense. The physical church is where the people of God assemble for worship. A church building stands as a visible reminder and sign - a kind of sacrament - of the body of Christ: his sacramental body, the real presence housed within the tabernacle, and the ecclesial body, made up of the people who are the living stones of Christ's church drawing life from our Head. Today's feast is truly a feast of the whole Christ, Body and Head. This feast also providentially occurs in the month when we are reminded in a particular way of the connection between every part of the church. For the church is not merely those of us alive now. November began with the celebration of All Saints - living members of that part of Christ's body we call the 'Church Triumphant', who aid us by their prayers. During this month we, the 'Church Militant', are reminded of the goal of our life's journey, and in confident hope we dedicate ourselves to praying for that other part of the church who are being prepared for the perfection of heaven, the 'Church Penitent'. And today in particular, those who have laid down their lives for something bigger than themselves. May their souls, and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace.
