

One of the highlights of Advent for a parish priest is seeing various re-tellings of the Christmas story by children of different ages. The story traditionally begins with Mary and Joseph learning of God's plan from the Angel, and finishes with the visit of the Magi and the holy family's flight into Egypt. The story unfolds over the fortnight covered by this newsletter. The high point of the story is the birth of Our Saviour, in the stable of Bethlehem, placed in the manger. Heaven and earth meet in this place, where the Word of God who took flesh in his mother's womb now begins his life in the



Whilst the secular observance of Christmas quickly gives way to the celebration of the New Year, the great feast of Our Lord's Nativity is the beginning of 12 days of rejoicing, before the celebration of the Epiphany and the final part of the Christmas season which takes us well into January. We can hardly do justice to the mystery of God being born as one of us in a single day. Nor is it enough just to think in terms of commemorating a past event, momentous and unique though it was. This is something that involves us. Jesus Christ shared our humanity, in order that we might share his divinity. The greatest gift of Christmas is the gift of a share in his divine life. Let us remember to give thanks to God, making a gift of ourselves to him in return.

I wish you all a blessed Christmas and New Year. May the joy the Saviour's birth renew your hope and deepen in your hearts the certainty of God's love for us; the love made visible in the crib, on the cross, and on the altar each time we gather to worship God united with the same Jesus Christ, the Son of God and Son of Mary.

CHRISTMAS MASSES: We will follow the pattern established in recent years of two family Masses on Christmas Eve (5pm and 6.30pm), a 'Midnight' Mass at 11pm (carols from 10.30pm), and on Christmas morning, a quiet dawn Mass at 8am and a sung Mass at 10am.

CHRISTMAS CARDS AND POSTERS: Please take one or more of our parish Christmas cards, and use them to invite friends and neighbours to our Christmas Masses. It is also a good witness to display a Christmas poster in your window to remind passers-by of the significance of this season – posters are now available in the porch. The cards include a QR code linking to a message (text and video) from Fr Matthew. If you prefer, hard copies of the message are also available in the porch.

CHRISTMAS OFFERING: By tradition the collection at the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses and anything else marked explicitly for the Christmas offering forms a significant part of the priest's annual income (along with the Easter offering). Contributions to the Christmas offering can be gift aided using a special envelope or via the screen in the porch. This is because they are considered donations to the diocesan charity, which are specifically allocated for the support of the local parish clergy. Many thanks in advance.

BCCS CRIB COLLECTION: It is the Bishop's wish that the cribs in churches throughout the diocese provide an opportunity to support the excellent and much-needed work of BCCS (Brentwood Catholic Children's Society). You can support this collection at any point up until Candlemas either by a cash donation at the crib, via the giving screens in the porch, or scanning the QR code by the crib. As you visit the crib, please also pray for the work of BCCS and for the children and young people it supports in difficult moments in their lives.
