SECOND SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (A) - Mass Book Pg 125

(Isaiah 49:3, 5-6, 1 Corinthians 1:1-3, John 1:14a, 12a)

We're back in Ordinary Time, the liturgical colour is green, but it seems as though we're not in too much of a hurry to leave the Christmas season behind. The crib is still here, following the tradition of keeping it up until Candlemas, and today's gospel is almost a rerun of last week's: the baptism of the Lord as recounted by John the Baptist himself. But first, we hear words that we hear in every celebration of Mass. Behold the Lamb of God that takes away the sins of the world.

When we hear these words, perhaps the image that comes to mind is that of fluffy lambs gambolling through green fields in the spring. Or we might think of the lamb typically found at the crib scene, brought by the shepherds. If so, then this gift is no less significant and prophetic than the gifts brought by the wise men. A Jew hearing those words of John the Baptist would immediately think of the Passover: the annual remembering of the greatest event of Israel's history: their deliverance from slavery in Egypt, with the passover lamb at the centre of the celebration. The Passover is quite different from other sacrifices in that the lamb is not sacrificed in the temple and offered as a burnt offering on the altar, but eaten as part of a ritual meal in the home. But in Jerusalem, prior to the Passover meal in family homes, the lambs were brought to the temple to be blessed by the priests and then slaughtered in the Temple precinct. Lambs that may well have been reared by shepherds in the fields outside Bethlehem, which is barely a stone's throw from Jerusalem. John the Baptist knew all this - we often forget that he came from a priestly family: his father Zechariah was a priest and this role was passed on father to son.

In the early chapters of Johns' gospel, Jesus is addressed by very exalted titles, such as Son of God, King of Israel, and Messiah, by people who've barely met him. It is striking then that John the Baptist, who possesses a

privileged knowledge refers to him with this title in particular. Jesus is the true Passover Lamb of God: and all that we shall celebrate a couple of months from now in the great three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday is contained in this simple phrase which we hear at every Mass, right before Holy Communion.

Why are we here, week-in-week out? Simply, to worship God and to be fed by the Lamb, who shares his life with us. Here, at Mass, we are able to fulfil the principal reason for our existence, which is to give glory to God, something which he gives us the means to do, and not for his benefit but ours. John shows his followers, the one who can satisfy the deepest longing of their heart, the one we need as the constant reference point for our lives: Jesus Christ. As we go out from the celebration of Mass each week, let us keep pointing towards him, the true centre of our lives.
