



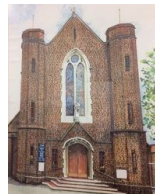

FIFTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (A) - Mass Book Pg 133

(Isaiah 58:6-10, 1 Corinthians 2:1-5, Matthew 5:13-16)

The theme of light keeps appearing in our readings, and that is no bad thing during the darkness of winter, for light represents the promise of a victory which sustains us in moments of darkness. Last week we began the Sermon on the Mount, which we continue with this week and next. We have heard St Matthew identify Jesus and specifically his preaching as bringing light to a people who had walked in darkness.

There is a twist in today's message. We are accustomed to hearing 'Jesus is the light of the world' and yet today we hear 'YOU are the light of the world'. We are also told 'you are the salt of the earth'. Salt makes a difference to whatever it is added to, enhancing the flavour. Whilst light enables us to see more clearly. As disciples of Jesus Christ, which should be making a positive difference to the world around us and all those we meet, in our homes and in our workplaces. The light we bring is not our own light, but the light of Jesus Christ, reflected in our lives. Our faith should make a visible difference to our lives. The beatitudes which we heard last week gives us a sense of what that might look like: a life lived for others rather than for ourselves. For there is a note of caution. Salt must not lose its saltiness, and light must not be hidden. We must remain close to Christ, and allow him to transform and renew us so that we remain faithful to him do not lose sight of our true calling and purpose.

Wednesday is the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. I have the privilege once again of celebrating the feast in the very place where Our Lady appeared to a young poor girl named Bernadette. We should be inspired by her courage, remaining firm in bearing witness to what she knew to be true even though she didn't fully understand, in spite of opposition from many who were considered cleverer and more powerful. We too are called to be faithful in our own way, humbling trusting in God and walking in the light of Christ. In this way, he may use us, as he used Bernadette, to accomplish the spread of his kingdom.
